Of plastic bottles is about one ton of plastic waste




Why is recycling at school important?

Recycling one bottle can make a big difference...




We did a survey on how the club impacted our members outside of school, here are the results!

We've placed recycling bins in each of the classrooms on campus encouraging students and teachers to throw their bottles and cans in there instead of the trash cans!












6th period
