AR 2012 - Program is continuing. Recycling collection services are still offered within the franchise agreements in most service areas of the County. 2,634 tons of paper and 426 tons of other material were collected from commercial sources. 854 tons of paper, 2 tons of metals, 4,535 tons of greenwaste, 40 tons of organics, 323 tons of white goods, 1,752 tons from construction, and 73 tons of other materials collected from industrial sources. The waste haulers sent a letter to businesses and multi-family complexes, with County input, informing them of the AB 341 Mandatory Commercial Recycling (MCR) regulations. RCWMD has updated our website, sent a press release through our County Executive Office and provided information on MCR regulation at community events. The total visits to the Department website has been 39,560, pageviews for public notices is 1,024, and pageviews for recycling and composting for business is 443. The Department had a link created on the County's business registration website to our Department's Mandatory Commercial Recycling webpage. In addition, the Department worked with the County's Building and Safety group to have a MCR message added to the electronic business license renewal notification. RCWMD has also hired an intern to help with Planning as well as MCR notification, he has been sending e-mails to businesses on our list that are subject to the regulations, but not recycling through a hauler. This has generated calls from businesses that are self-hauling their recyclable or once informed have been able to contract with their waste hauler for recycling services. According to the waste haulers there are 1,620 businesses within Riverside County that are subject to the MCR regulations.
