#### **DEFINITION OF COMMERCIAL BUSINESS**

"Commercial business" means a firm, partnership, proprietorship, joint- stock company, corporation, or association, whether forprofit or nonprofit, strip mall, industrial facility, or a multifamily residential dwelling of five units or greater.

# AB 341 MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING LAW, CHAPTER 476, STATUTES OF 2011

Businesses (including public entities) generating four cubic yards or more of solid waste per week must arrange for recycling services:

- Subscribe to a hauler service
- Self-haul recyclables
- Arrange for third party pick-up
- Commercial property owners
   May require tenants to comply





### WHY ORGANICS?


- There is no way to 75%
   diversion from landfill without it
- More than 30% of total disposal is compostable
  - or digestible
- Methane emissions are a potent greenhouse gas



# AB 1826 MANDATORY COMMERCIAL ORGANICS RECYCLING, CHAPTER 727, STATUTES OF 2014

Businesses must take one or any combination of the following actions:

- Source-separate organic waste from other waste and subscribe to an organic waste recycling service.
- Recycle organic waste onsite, or selfhaul for organics recycling.

# SB 1383 SHORT LIVED CLIMATE POLLUTANTS: ORGANIC WASTE METHANE EMISSION REDUCTIONS, STATUTES OF 2016

- SB 1383 builds upon the Mandatory Commercial Organics law
- Requires reducing organics to landfill by 75% by 2025
- Expands the definition of organics to include fibers such as paper and cardboard






#### **SB 1383**

### Three-container Organic Waste Collection Services

Jurisdictions must <u>provide</u> a green container, a blue container, and a gray container.

- Green: source separated organics
- Blue: traditional recyclables
- Gray: all other non-organic waste
- Split containers allowed





#### **SB 1383**

### CONTAINER LABELLING REQUIREMENTS

- Beginning Jan 1, 2022, a jurisdiction must place a label on the container or lid
- Labels must use language and/or graphics that indicate the primary materials accepted and prohibited; or
- Containers must be imprinted with text or images that indicate primary materials accepted and prohibited





# SB 1383 ORGANIC WASTE GENERATOR REQUIREMENTS

#### Organic waste generators must:

- Subscribe to the local collection service provided by the jurisdiction
- Self-haul organic waste

#### **Commercial Businesses must:**

- Provide containers for customers that comply with labeling or color requirements
- Educate employees
- Inspect organic waste containers









# SB 1383 COMMERCIAL BUSINESS OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

### Commercial businesses must:

- Arrange for organic waste collection services and provide access to containers
- Annually provide information to employees, contractors, tenants, customers about proper sorting
- Provide/arrange access for inspections

**Health Facilities** with ≥ 100 beds and on-site food facility
