



Field Checks

Field checks are conducted in advance of bin delivery in order to assure that access to the bin can be done by our large collection vehicles. They will also identify that bin enclosures are properly designed and include appropriate gates and wall protection. Customers will be notified of any condition that does not meet the criteria for trash bin service. A waiver will be sent to the customer if one of the conditions does not meet criteria. Customer will sign waiver and service will be authorized to begin.


What is Organics Recycling?


Organics include **food waste and green waste**. California businesses have been required to recycle their organic waste since State Assembly Bill 1826 was passed on April 1, 2016. The law includes schools, hotels, hospitals, stores, restaurants, for profit or nonprofit organizations, as well as residential dwellings with 5+ units. Multi-family complexes of 5+ units are only required to divert their landscaping materials (green waste). Organics recycling requirements will be phased in over several years and will help California to achieve its statewide recycling goal of 75% by 2020.



Organics and food waste should be placed in **32 gallon blue containers.**

<u>Contact us</u> for assistance in determining the correct container size and frequency of service for your restaurant or business needs. If you are required to recycle organic waste, you will need a second container that is separate from your recycling container.






